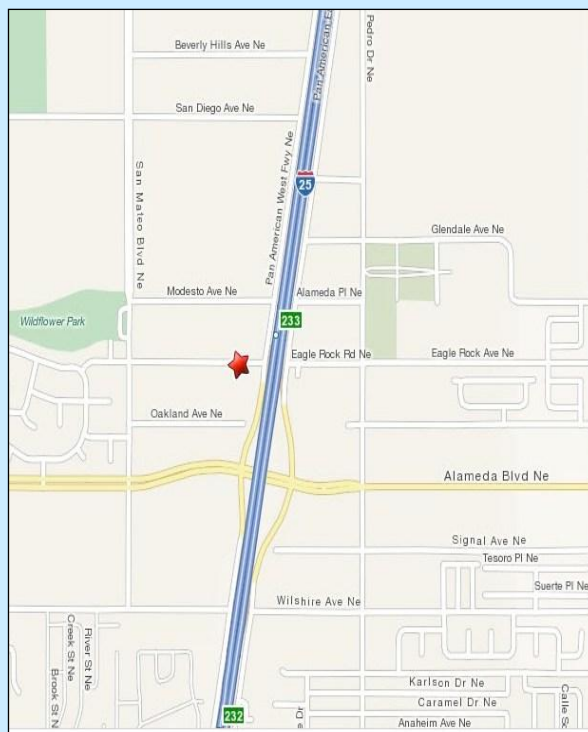

The Classes

Improve your sign skills to better communicate with the deaf children and adults you live, work or interact with.

The classes are interactive, allowing you to practice ASL with your classmates.

Our qualified instructors enjoy teaching and have extensive knowledge and experience teaching ASL.

The classes are both fun and challenging!

Meet others with the same desire for learning ASL.

Beginner: This is the first part in five-levels. No previous knowledge required.

Beginner Advanced: Some prior sign instruction or interaction with people who are deaf.

Intermediate: Have basic conversational skills, seeking increased vocabulary and syntax.

Intermediate Advanced: Strong conversational skills, seeking increased vocabulary and fluency.

On the first night of class, teachers will informally assess student skill levels and recommend a change in classes, if necessary.
